

was all the sum of His wealth, and His power to tame that wilderness. He preferred their presence to that of other things or persons for without them He would be sitting alone atop that wagon seat with all His precious cargo without the force to carry the wagon forward.

I then realized there was not just one wagon and one team of oxen. When I looked back over that prairie there were many teams crossing in every direction, each moving steadily toward their goal. As they heaved forward in the great wind, the same Wagon Master was seated on every wagon seat. The Wagon Master never used a whip or prod on His oxen. He simply handled His teams gently with these harness reins.

When I saw the numerous wagons, the Wagon Master took me and pulled back the canvas of the wagon nearest us that I might see what was inside. "In here," He said, "are all the things that pertain to My kingdom being established on the earth." The wagon bed was filled with lots of tightly packed parcels representing all of God's will for mankind and for the earth **literally wrapped in prayer.** Now I

understood why the Wagon Master so cherished these oxen. **Without them His precious cargo would never reach its destination.** Without His beloved oxen those parcels would be stranded in the wilderness and left to be wasted by the elements and eventually forgotten.

The final picture I saw was of wagon tracks cutting through that prairie grass long after the wagons has passed over it. The Lord spoke to me and said, "Whether it be hours, days, weeks, months, or years later, these tracks will be followed by those who will establish My kingdom and settle the things that these oxen, representing My intercessors, have pulled through in prayer." I realized later there were also men appointed to walk alongside the oxen as they pulled. These men were attending and watching out for the individual ox. I believe they are angels sent by God to assist and guard the intercessors.

In Scripture the ox represents a servant. In this vision the oxen were those who serve the Lord through intercession. He loved them much

because He Himself is the Servant of all men. The Lord said to me that in the day when all work shall be accounted for to His intercessors who have been diligent in their labor, it will be like it was in Matthew 25:23. The Master will say, "Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a few things, I will make you a ruler over many. Enter thou into the joy of the Lord." Because these special servants had taken a low position they would be called up to seats of honor at the wedding supper.

I believe God seeks for people who will present themselves as living sacrifices and lay down their lives for prayer, fasting, watching, and intercession. Down through the ages time and again in the Bible, God searched the earth for those who would stand in the gap. **Prov. 14:4 says, "Where no oxen are the stall is clean, but much increase comes by the strength of the ox."** I pray that when God comes He will find you in your stall waiting on Him to harness you in that yoke of prayer together with many others so that the increase of His government on the earth may be accomplished.
